President's Report, August 2023

Stan Harrison, Dave Draper, Rev. Bull, and I attended several Vet Fest meetings for the Vet Fest event held on the 22nd July. Stan and his merchandise team

were handling sales. I am not going to mention his crew because I know I'd forget someone. Not sure what the overall Vets Fest attendance was, but it was less than last year. The Army National Guard brought in a Chinook. Visitors were able to sit in the web-seats and question the crew. The rotor wash from that puppy was huge! (Click on image to view flight.)

I had a phone conversation with a Chapter member who had a cataract surgery meeting with his eye physician at the VA. Sounds like something I'll have in the future as my last eye exam indicated the beginnings of cataracts. Maybe that's why I wanted to do the Pledge twice at our last meeting? That's my story and I'm sticking to it!

I attended the VVA Michigan State Council meeting in Waterford with Tim and Kathy Driscoll and Sandie Wilson on July 23rd. Some of the items discussed were:

- Michigan had an increase of .8% in membership.
- Eight hundred and fifty-six delegates registered for the convention, and they anticipate that total to increase to 900.
 - Hot on the minds of many is the future of VVA.
- The convention hotel had 600 rooms reserved and are now sold out. There is an additional hotel for the overflow.
- State Council President John Riling advised that National is planning on up to three more conventions, and the tentative closing of VVA is February 2028. This may be voted on at the convention this year, and that date is fluid.

VVA's Vice President Tom Burke was in attendance

and fielded many questions about the future of VVA and the resolutions that will be voted on this year. I've asked John Riling to attend a future Chapter meeting and discuss what the Council's and Chapter's future options are. Yes, we've had many discussions on this topic, and it has been fully researched by Luker and his team. It would still be nice to hear from our state leadership about VVA's future.

We had a Memorial visitor from Chapter 1037, Charlotte, Florida. They left a note with a star from a retired U.S. flag. I've sent Chapter 1037 an email message thanking them for visiting and paying their respects. Speaking of the Memorial, the grounds are looking outstanding.

Honoring August's Anniversaries on the Wall

Lance Corporal Kendal Lee Benney, Jr. was born on February 22, 1948, to Mr. and Mrs. Kendal L. Benney of Ypsilanti. Kendal lived with his father and stepmother in Big Rapids, Michigan until September of 1965, and after that, he attended Ypsilanti High School. He left Ypsilanti High School during his Junior year and enlisted in the Marine Corps in March of 1966.



Lance Corporal Kendal Lee Benney, Jr. began his tour of duty in Quang Nam Province, South Vietnam in December of 1966 serving with C Company, First Battalion, Seventh Marines, First Marine Division as a machine gunner. Kendal was killed on August 20, 1967, while standing watch when he suffered multiple fragmentation wounds from a bomb.

Lance Corporal Kendal Lee Benney, Jr. is survived by his mother, father, stepmother, two sisters and one

brother who was serving in South Vietnam when Kendal was killed. Kendal's brother was discharged from the Army and escorted his brother back to the "World" for internment. Kendal lived 19 years, 5 months, and 28 days. He is resting in the Altona Cemetery in Altona, Michigan. Kendal's name is listed on the Vietnam Memorial in Ypsilanti Township under Ypsilanti. His name also appears on the Vietnam Memorial in Washington, DC on Panel 25E Line 018.

Private First Class James William Davis was born on March 24, 1947, in Erie, Pennsylvania to Mr. and Mrs. William A. and Gretchen Raub Davis. James grew up in Belleville, Michigan, but lived in Ypsilanti. He is a 1965 graduate of Belleville High School where he lettered in football and swimming. James attended Michigan State

University and Cleary College. James was employed as a customer agent for Trans World Airlines at the Detroit Metropolitan Airport in Wayne, Michigan prior to entering the Marine Corps on December 13, 1968.

Private First Class Davis began his tour of duty in An Hoa, Quang Nam Province, South Vietnam on July 7, 1969, serving as a rifleman with I Company, 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines, 1st Marine Division. James was killed on August 13, 1969, because of small arms fire just one month and six days into his tour of duty "In-Country."

James William Davis is survived by his wife, an 11-month-old son, his parents, and two brothers. He lived 22 years, 4 months, and 10 days. He is resting in Washtenong Memorial Park in Ann Arbor, Michigan. James' name is listed on the Vietnam Memorial in Ypsilanti Township under Ypsilanti. His name also appears on the Vietnam Memorial in Washington, DC on Panel 19W Line 029.

Remembering Gary Lillie

Recall that, when we came home after military service, there was no Facebook or other IT ways of locating people. I think all of us who served in Vietnam or anywhere have felt the desire to reconnect with a military friend of old. This poem describes some of those feelings.

My Squad

I've spent a lot of time looking for you,

My squad.

Having those thoughts about you

Brings smiles to my face.

Sometimes I laugh out loud in a quiet room.

It brings funny looks from my friends,

But they don't know where I have been,

Veterans Family Health Issues

[Attached is a section of a well-written piece by our own Sandie Wilson on Veteran's family health issues related to toxic exposure. Sandie said this is chapter 1 because she didn't want to make it too long. So, look for chapter 2 in a later issue.]

It has now been 45 years that a group of us has been working on getting something resolved for the health issues of your children related to your military service. Most men took the approach of not needing health care, that was a woman task. Also, 99 percent of the Vietnam era children are now adults. Why worry? Time solves everything. Take 2 pills and it will be better. The problem is that not every health problem gets resolved. Many last a lifetime.

Some of you had adult children follow in the parent's footsteps and served in the Middle East or other contaminated areas. Our government leaders said this would not be a repeat of Vietnam. True, they did not expose this military to the 7 forever toxins used during Vietnam. But they were exposed to 21 other toxins. That means you can have grandchildren with birth defects resulting from the parent exposure to 28 different toxins. When someone in your family becomes pregnant, are you increasing your prayers for the next 9 months?

I am requesting you take ACTION. If you are a veteran told you were not entitled to benefits, the situation has changed. Your retired income is probably small enough to qualify for VA health care. Sign up today. If you believe you were exposed, sign up for the toxic exposure registry. You are likely now on medications. VA delivery is a cost-savings service to which you are entitled. The VA health care is a joint effort with Michigan Medicine and is outstanding.

VVA has a Service Rep at the VA Hospital. The Washtenaw County Veterans Department has outstanding Service Reps. With the increase in presumptive diseases, get your available disability rating increased. This will help you and your dependent today and in the future. Champ V is there for dependents even after you transfer to the other side of the grass.

VVA has been meeting with the Air Force, VA, NIH about the "Ranch Hand" research specimens for over a year. A decision was made to transfer these 93 million body specimens to a medical storage facility. Medical researchers will have access to the specimens and the original data. This means current researchers will be able to access 30 years of longitudinal data. The Prostate Cancer researchers are overjoyed.

A medical research statistician has published a vetted report on the birth defects obtained from the "Ranch Hand" data prior to its being "cleaned-up" by the liars in government. That report closely matches the data in the Birth Defects Registry that veterans have utilized for the past 30 years.

In lobbying our Congresspersons, the first comment from this is, "show me the research that proves your issue." We spent 8 years educating veterans and pushing Congress to get a law requiring research on toxic exposure for children and grandchildren of veterans. President Obama signed the law. The first step, a feasibility study, was done by NIH. During the Trump administration, no progress.

VVA sent a letter to the current VA Secretary urging the research to be done. The Secretary responded it could not be done because there was not a national birth defect registry.

He was partially right. There is not a government sponsored national birth defects registry. In the 1980s, 41 states had statewide birth defects registries. Today 10, states claim to have statewide registries paid for by the Center for Disease Control. Each state determines its own procedure. In 1994, the federal government issued a policy that each state would list any birth defect the child was noted to have on the birth certificate. If it is on the birth certificate, it is a structural defect noted on the examination at birth. In addition, each state takes cord blood specimens to detect conditions that develop later but can be treated before they appear. Most states test for 7 diseases. Michigan tests for 25 diseases.
